Wildlife doc finds butterfly

butterfly has been discovered in the Andes by a Wandsworth naturalist.

The species, found in the mountain forests, has never before been seen by anyone from outside the region.

Dr Paul Toyne from

Wandsworth, an international conservation officer for the World Wide Fund for Nature, spent five years researching wildlife in an area which is constantly

under threat.

He hopes the evidence his team gathered of important and rare species will persuade the government of Ecuador to stop any more

trees being cut down. He said, "We were involved in a scientific study based in south-west Ecuador looking at rare parrots.

"But the area was under threat and we wanted to prove it was important for other types of wildlife, so we started making an inventory


of all the species of butterfly.
"We found 280 different
types and the one I found was
a completely new species."
Traditionally anyone who
discovers a new species has

discovers a new species has it named after themselves but in a bid to raise cash for further expeditions Dr Toyne held a raffle to name his butterfly. It was won by six-year-old

Pronophila, is brown and has a wing span of eight cms. It was found in Podocarpus

National Park—the only protected area in the region.

Dr Toyne, of Limes
Gardens, said, "Already 90
per cent of the forests in the area have been destroyed.

"They are cut down and used as agricultural land but after two years the plots

can't be used any more because of soil erosion - so the farmers chop more.

"We know a fair amount about the world's butterflies but there's still species being discovered when people go into isolated areas.

"We wonder what we might be missing if habitats are destroyed before we can document them.
